## Annual Results 2025

During 2025, Fundación Nuevas Familias México consolidated its operations as a multidisciplinary, people-centered organization dedicated to the ethical and comprehensive care of women participating as gestational carriers.



The year presented operational and contextual challenges typical of an organization in consolidation; however, stable clinical outcomes, strong compliance mechanisms, and robust social and medical follow-up were successfully maintained.

The financial support provided by Surrogacy México enabled uninterrupted operations, strengthening of multidisciplinary care, and implementation of preventive social work, psychology and nutritional programs. Notably, the Foundation achieved zero pregnancy losses after 12 weeks and 23 successful births, underscoring the effectiveness of its care model.



Our work takes place in an environment where Mexico has positioned itself as a surrogacy-friendly country, allowing these processes to be carried out ethically, responsibly, and with a people-centered approach. In addition, we organize monthly activities that encourage connection, shared experiences, and mutual support among gestational carriers, strengthening community and trust.

Looking ahead to 2026, the Foundation is positioned to improve outcomes through targeted research, nutritional partnerships, and continuous process optimization, reinforcing both social impact and clinical performance.

### Introduction and Institutional Overview

Fundación Nuevas Familias México began operations on July 19, 2024, and throughout 2025 consolidated its role as a non-profit organization dedicated to protecting the rights, dignity, and well-being of gestational carriers. Supported entirely by Canadian investors, the Foundation ensured ethical, safe, and people-centered surrogacy processes during a year of operational consolidation.



### Who We Are and Our Purpose

The Foundation accompanies and supports women involved in surrogacy processes through a rights-based, multidisciplinary approach. Operating within Mexico's surrogacy-friendly environment, all activities are conducted ethically and responsibly, prioritizing safety, transparency, and respect.

### Multidisciplinary Team

The Foundation's team includes specialists in nutrition, psychology, social work, gynecology, obstetrics, pediatrics, and neonatology. This structure ensures continuity of care, risk mitigation, and compliance with international standards.



### **Medical Care and Clinical Facilities**

Comprehensive care is delivered through coordinated clinical follow-up at the Foundation's offices and partner clinics. Strategic alliances with recognized hospitals reinforce patient safety and emergency preparedness.

### **Social Work and Geographic Reach**

In 2025, the Foundation supported gestational carriers in Mexico City, Estado de México, Puebla, and Hidalgo. A total of 231 in-person social work visits were conducted as part of a preventive and compliance-focused model.

### **Clinical Outcomes and Achievements**

The program achieved 23 successful births, zero pregnancy losses after 12 weeks, and stable clinical performance across embryo transfer cycles, reflecting effective multidisciplinary coordination.

### **Strategic Outlook for 2026**

Planned initiatives include a nutritional research project focused on implantation outcomes, expanded nutritional support through corporate partnerships, and continuous improvement of clinical and social indicators.

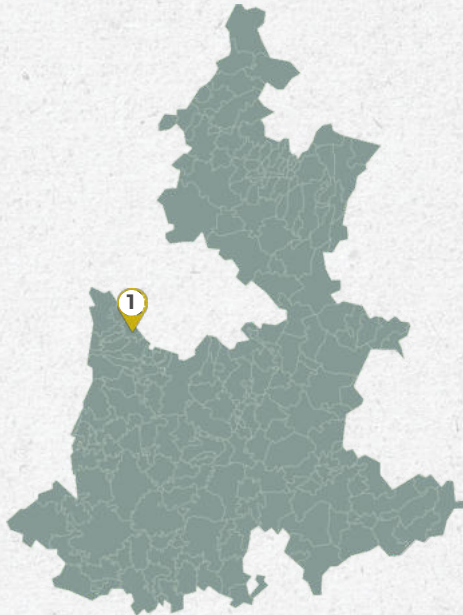

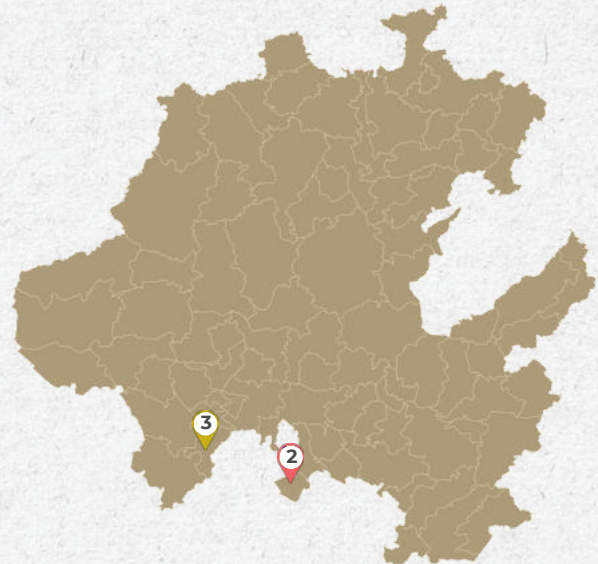

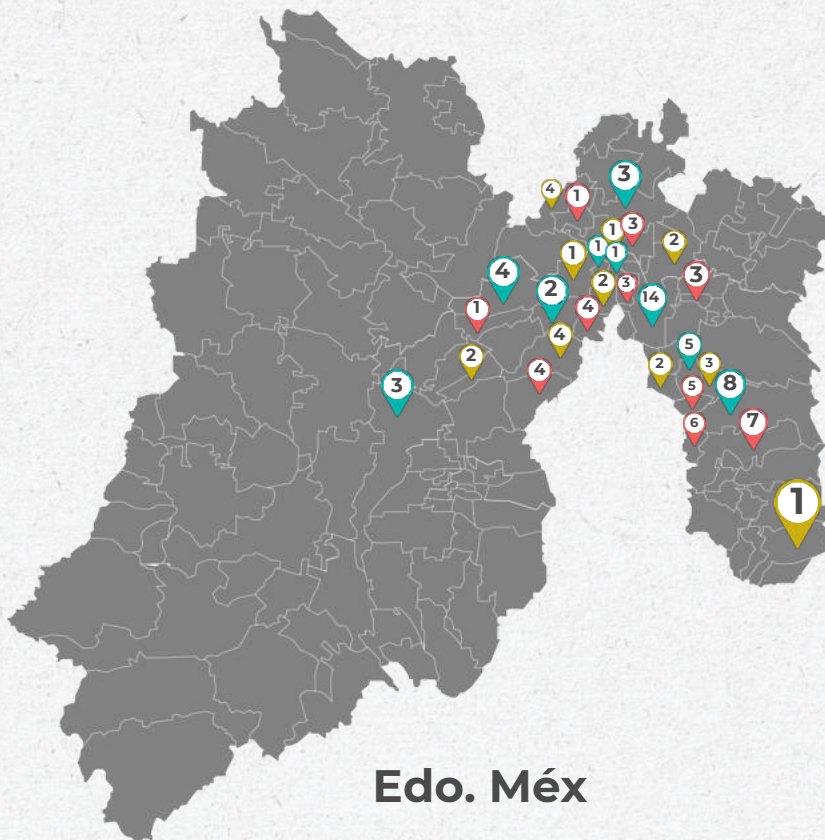
## Geographic Reach of Gestational Carrier Social Work Area



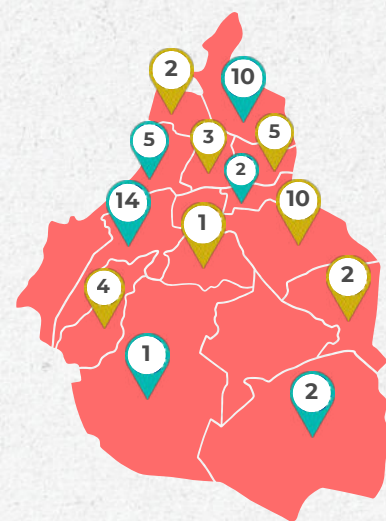

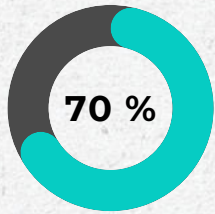

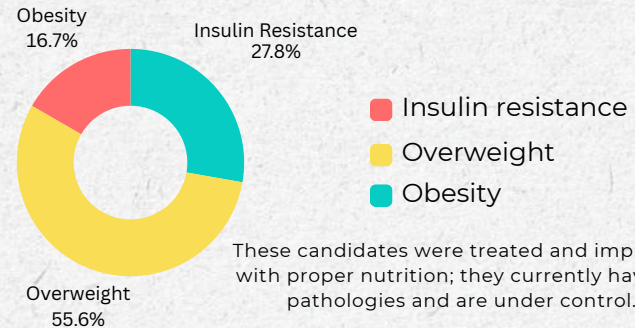


### Gestational pathologies

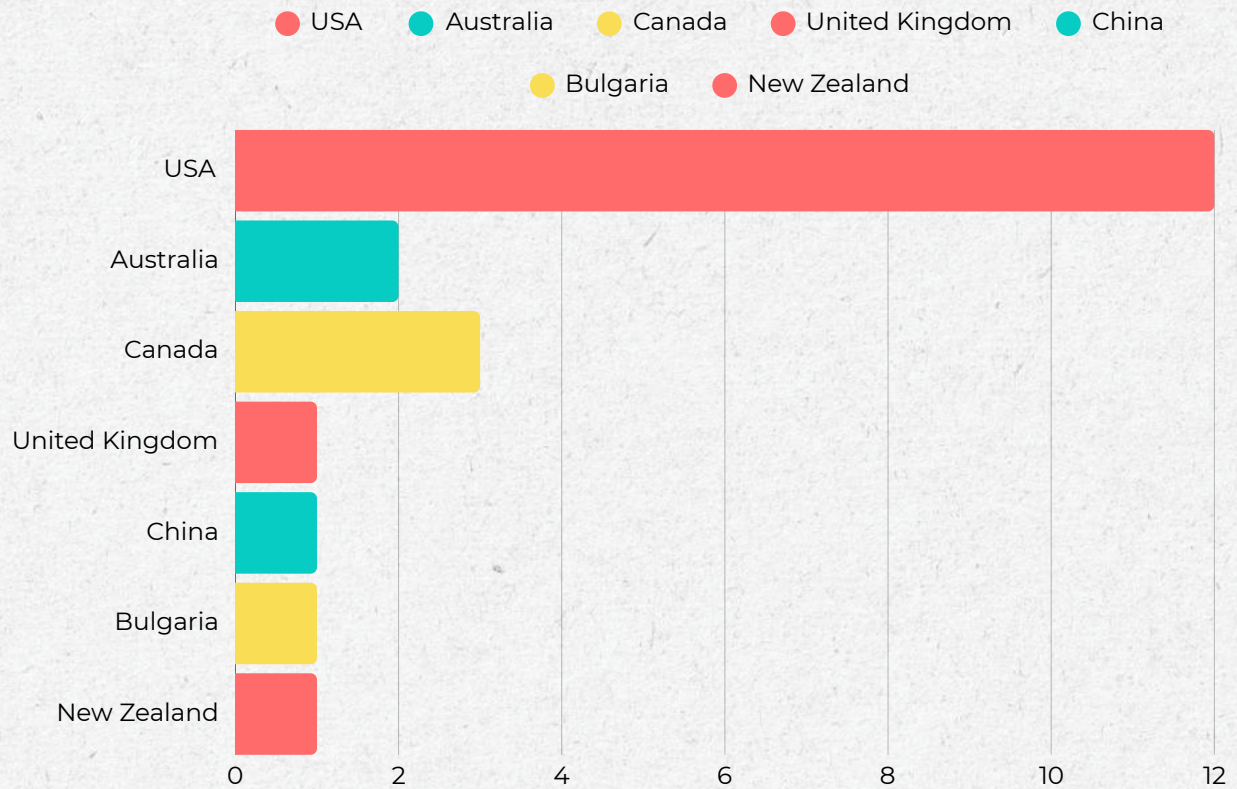

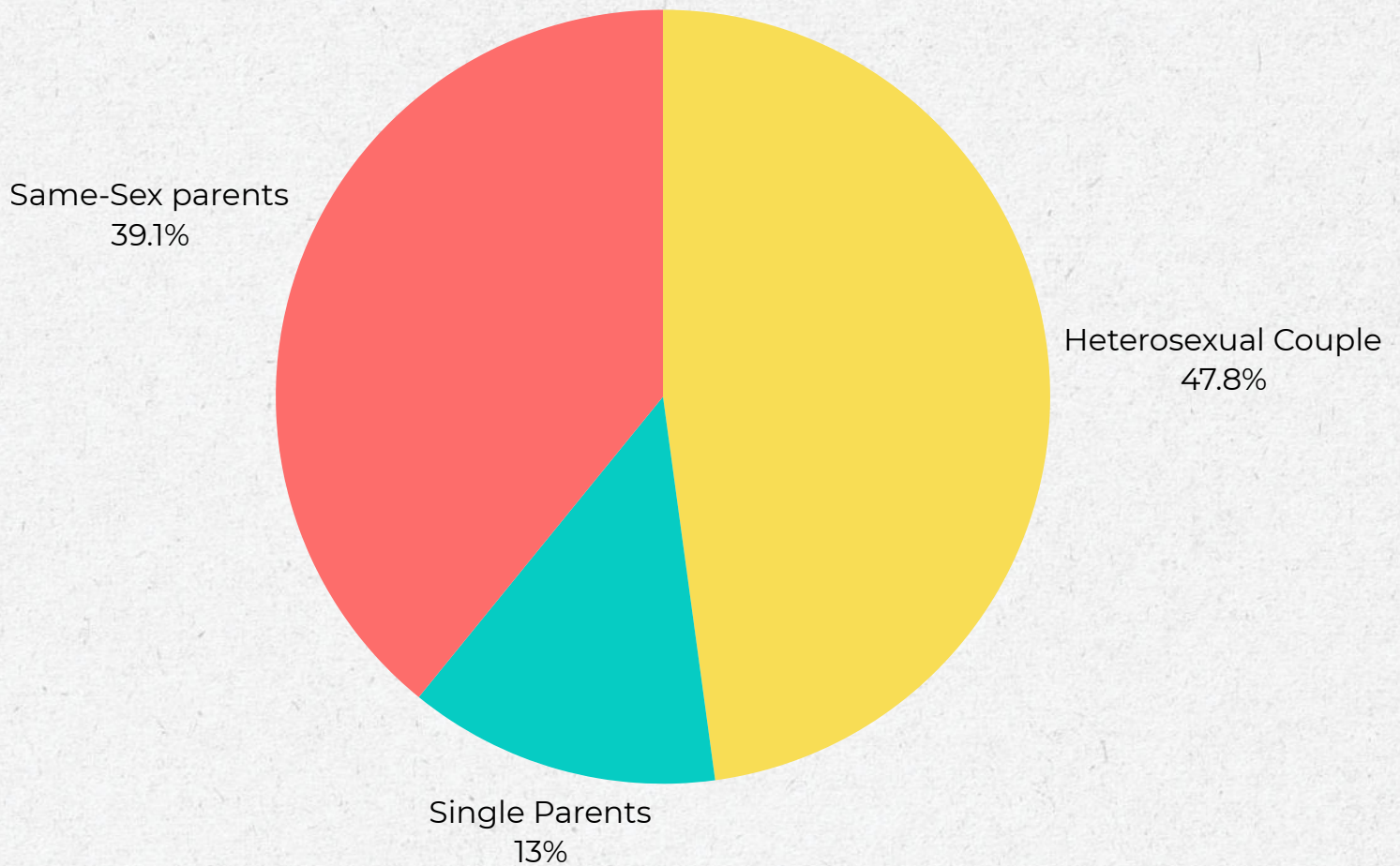


## Intended Parents by Nationality ( Total: 19 )





## Types of IPs

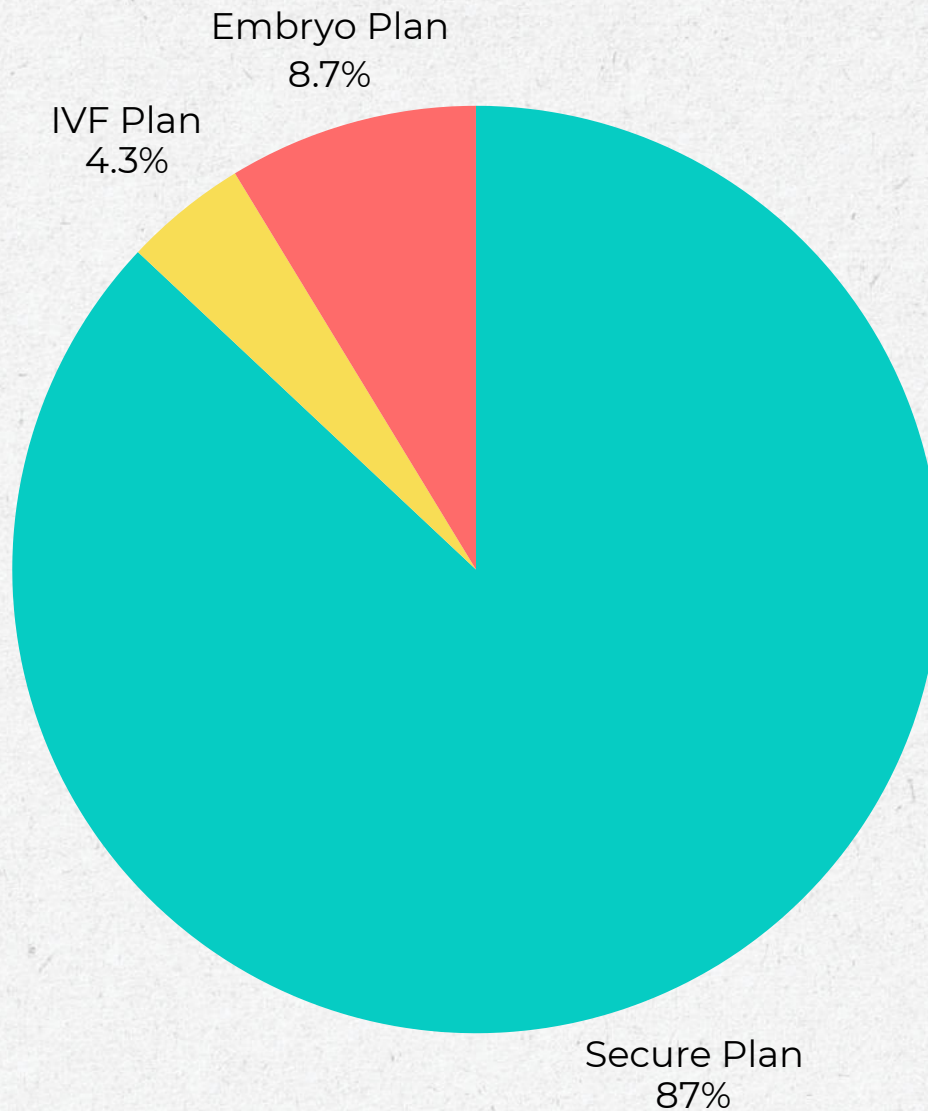


### Distribution:

## Distribution of Births by Plan ( Total: 23 )

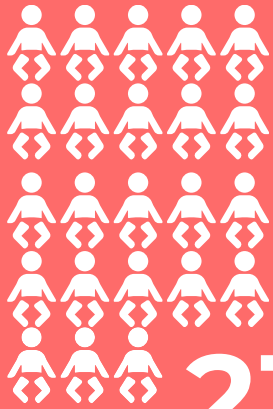

## Strategic Nutrition Goals 2026 for Implantation Improvement and Healthy Pregnancies

### Research Project

The project will begin with the administration of Omega-3 to candidates, who will undergo a pre-selection screening process. This project aims to improve the egg's implantation capacity at the time of transfer. It will be complemented with proper nutrition, exercise, and ongoing monitoring of the selected candidates.

Over the course of the year, a gradual increase in positive betas is expected, which will benefit the clinic and its overall outcomes.

### Donations and Nutritional Support

Support will be sought for gestational carriers, primarily from renowned companies such as Nestlé and Grupo del Fuerte. This support will focus on nutritional assistance and safeguarding their diet, resulting in a triad that ensures the gestational carriers maintain a healthy weight, proper nutrient intake, and ultimately a healthy baby and a healthy pregnancy.
